North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) 1994 Impact on Health in Mexico:

- **Mexican Constitution** gutted of agrarian reform and *EJIDO* system +
- **Protective tariffs lifted** → mass import of subsidized US agri-business goods (cattle, corn) → *Campesinos* can't compete →
- **Mass urbanization** → unemployment → weak unions → lower wages
- **Maquiladores** → rollback of human rights, worker saftey, environmental protection, public health →
- Widening income gap → more malnourished kids (and more obesity).
- **Increased poverty** → street youth → loss of hope →
- Pandemic of **crime**, **violence**, **drug trade**, **kidnappings**→
- Increased social unrest, protest, **Zapatista uprising**
- **Authoritarian repression,** human rights abuses, corruption →
- Speculative investors pull out, **peso crash** (1/3 businesses close) →
- **Structural Adjustment:** privatization, cutback of public spending →
- Increased illegal migration to US→spread of STD and AIDS→
